The next scheduled Parish Council meeting will be held on Tuesday 21st April 2026 at 18:30 in Seavington Millennium Hall.

Seavington Parish Council is sad to announce the resignation of Councillor Reyland, who has stepped down from his role with immediate effect. The Council formally acknowledged his decision and expressed sincere thanks for his many years of dedicated service to the community, highlighting his hard work and commitment during his time in office.

Prior to his resignation, Councillor Reyland reported on village maintenance matters, noting that the Parish Ranger continues to maintain cleanliness throughout Seavington. He is going to request that moss be cleared from the pavement beneath the trees along New Road to improve safety and accessibility for residents.

Councillor S Ashton attended the meeting on behalf of Councillor J Roundell-Greene and provided several updates. It was noted that council tax bills have been issued by Somerset Council before final figures were confirmed by the Government.

As a result, an additional cost of £40,000 was incurred due to the requirement to send the bills by first-class post. Any inaccuracies, particularly where resident information was not updated in time, will be corrected and revised bills issued where necessary.

The Somerset Rivers Authority precept will remain unchanged for the coming period. Updates were also shared regarding proposed changes by the Local Government Boundary Commission, which are currently awaiting Government approval. If agreed, these changes would come into effect for the 2027 local elections and could see the Seavington parishes incorporated into the South Ilminster district.

Finally, Somerset Council acknowledged that concerns over potholes in the area remain ongoing, with the issue continuing to be monitored.
