The next scheduled Parish Council meeting is to be held on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> December 2025 at 6.30pm in Seavington Millennium Hall.

The Parish Council met this month with a number of updates and discussions that are likely to be of interest to Seavington residents. Here's a summary of some of the points that were covered:

## **Bleed Kit Now Available in the Village**

The Parish is pleased to announce that it has received a Bleed Kit, generously provided through funding from the Police and Crime Commissioner. These kits are an increasingly important community resource, designed to provide immediate assistance in the event of a serious injury. The Parish Council would like to express its sincere thanks to the Seavington Village Shop and Café for kindly agreeing to host the Bleed Kit on the exterior wall of their building, ensuring that it is easily accessible to the public in an emergency.

## **Planning Application 21/02654/FUL**

Residents may be aware that the planning application relating to the storage and construction of Carnival Floats has now been formally reinstated. The Parish Council is currently reviewing the details of the updated application and preparing a considered response on behalf of the community. **The deadline for submitting comments is 3rd December, and the Parish Council strongly encourages all residents to review the information and submit their own responses via the Somerset Council website.** Community engagement is vital, and a high volume of local feedback helps to ensure that the views of the village are properly represented.

## **Playing Field Goal Post Replacement**

With regard to the playing field, it has unfortunately been noted that the existing goal post has been broken once again. It has outlasted its expected lifespan, as it was originally purchased to monitor whether there was a need. It has proved that having a goal that is moveable with the net attached is popular. After discussion, the Parish Council has agreed that a replacement is required and will therefore be purchasing a pair of new metal goal posts, which are expected to be more robust and able to withstand regular use whilst remaining portable for the mowers.
