The Parish Council met this month with a number of updates and discussions that are likely to be of interest to Seavington residents. Here's a summary of some of the points that was covered:

Parish Council Vacancy

There is currently a vacancy on the Parish Council, and we invite interested residents to consider joining. Flood Resilience Meeting

Seavington was represented at the Taunton Racecourse Flood Resilience Meeting, which provided valuable contacts and advice. The work involved is too large for one person, so the Flood Warden is seeking volunteers to join a local flood group.

Ranger

The village Ranger will tidy around the memorial before Remembrance Sunday.

Footpaths

Cllr England is happy to report the new footpath in Seavington St Mary is being well-used by residents.

Planning Matters

Approval has been granted for two local planning applications of note:

The first is for a part single-storey, part two-storey extension at 1 West Street Corner. This development will replace an existing single-storey extension and is expected to enhance the property's layout and usability while remaining in keeping with the surrounding area.

The second is for the re-roofing of the existing factory building at Branston Potatoes, located on Upton Lane. This application also includes the installation of solar PV panels to improve the site's energy efficiency, along with the erection of a screening structure for external water tanks.

In contrast, the reserved matters application for residential development (application 22/03382/REM)—which sought approval for appearance, layout, landscaping, and scale relating to a previously approved outline application—has been refused. This decision means the proposed development will not move forward in its current form.
